Workshop Raised latrines

Definitions:

Raised latrine:

 An emergency latrine solution (tank/platform/ superstructure) with above ground sludge storage

Emergency Kit:


Number of raised latrines forming an efficient transportation unit

Cluster:

Number of emergency kits configured as latrine block

Problem definition:

the availability of a compact (transportable), cost effective and robust emergency kit with a relatively high sludge tank capacity
