 Delivery of basic services is a building block towards Sustainable Development



Challenges

Extreme urbanization

The total number of cities and towns in India has increased from
> 2,250 in 1991
> 5,161 in 2001,
> 7,936 in 2011
(as per the 2011 census).



Challenges

- Changing consumption patterns and behaviours
- Lack of experienced personnel to tackle this rapidly changing environment
- Partial applicability of knowledge from developed world for the changing urban environment
- One solution does not fit the complexities of the cities



Challenges

- Whose responsibility city managers, citizens, private providers or all? How to share the responsibilities?
- Infrastructure and service delivery Should providers private and public focus on coverage or service delivery? How to balance it?
- Lack of knowledge and practical skills to provide best-fitting solutions
- Piece meal approach
- Many more



- If arge gap between sewage generated and treatment capacity: Only 30% of total sewage generated by urban India treated.
- Untreated discharge: 26.5 billion litres of untreated wastewater discharged into water bodies every day.
- Poor maintenance: discharge from 39% of STPs do not conform to environment protection standards.
- Massive investments (Rs 106 bn) for wastewater with limited focus on O&M.

In many instances, the wastewater / sanitation sector is fragmented - capital expenditure, service delivery, day-to-day management, all rests with different agencies making any reform or improvement difficult



Centralised approaches

- will not be able to provide all the answers -
- cannot cover the ever increasing population
