

### Establishment of an ecosan network in Kenya - Apr. 2010



In Kenya there is now awareness about ecosan amongst users, organisations and governmental institutions after 3.5 years of activities by the EU-SIDA-GTZ EcoSan Promotion Project (the funding for which has now ceased). GTZ is now supporting the establishment of an ecosan network in Kenya to link up all interested people to exchange ideas, information and events on ecosan. Moreover it is supporting the establishment of a foundation to provide training and further awareness raising workshops for users of about 1000 units of UDDTs at households and schools as well as a dozen

## Update on peepoo bags: "Forget flying toilets, it's all fertiliser" – Apr. 2010

International media is picking up on the issues of slum sanitation and the potential of peepoo bags. They write: "Time for the flying toilets may have ended after an invention of a biodegradable plastic bag — peepoo — that acts as a single-use toilet. The peepoo is a small biodegradable bag coated with a thin film of urea, which turns human waste into fertiliser. Peepoo will provide a cleaner and more environmentally friendly alternative to the flying toilets. The trials carried out in Silanga, Kibera proved successful and will be rolled out on a wide scale."

# First High-Level Meeting on sanitation and water in Washington – Apr. 2010

The first Annual High-Level Meeting (HLM) on sanitation and water hosted by UNICEF took place in Washington on 23 April 2010, bringing more than 30 ministers and policy makers together from North and South to review the progress of MDG and take concerted action to tackle the global sanitation and water crisis. Many countries, such as Ghana, Liberia and Ethiopia, committed to raising domestic budgets to meet regional commitments, such as those in Africa to spend 0.5% of Gross National Income (GNI) on sanitation.

## High level political talk on "Sanitation, Wastewater and Solid Waste Management: Linking the issues for a liveable city" – Mar. 2010

UN Habitat and the Sustainable Sanitation Alliance (SuSanA) organised this special event at the World Urban Forum in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil (WUF 5): "Linking the issues for a liveable city". A political stage was created to discuss key issues in urban management related to solid and liquid waste and how they impact on cities. Mr. Franz Marré, Head of Division Water, Energy, Urban Development at the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) was amongst the distinguished speakers who stressed the recognition of water and sanitation as a human right. ## Phosphorus Shortage: European challenges – Mar. 2010

The threatening shortage of phosphorus – a key component of fertilisers – is worrying for the world's food supplies. Global supply is limited and concentrated in just a few countries. Demand is increasing rapidly. Since there is no alternative for phosphorus, innovative strategies are needed to ensure its availability. Bas Eickhout and Lena Ek (both members of the European Parliament) and the Nutrient Flow Task Group intended this Mini Seminar to accelerate the search for solutions and help develop opportunities created by the phosphorus crisis.

### Philipines Testing of "My School Loo" Sanitation and Hygiene Education Material in schools in the Philippines – Mar. 2010



The German Toilet Organization (GTO) in cooperation with UN-Water recently developed a comprehensive set of sanitation and hygiene education material for schools called 'MY SCHOOL LOO' - aiming to generate sanitation and hygiene awareness among school children and to carry appreciation for the benefits of sanitation

and hygiene into families. With the local support of the Sustainable Sanitation Center of Xavier University a first testing of the material was carried out in two Elementary Schools in Cagayan de Oro, Philippines. The results are used to optimise the materials further.

## Campaign: "Every Poo needs a Loo" by WASH United and German Toilet Organisation – 22 Mar. 2010

More than two hundred people stood up for those who can't sit down and queued up behind a beautifully decorated wooden outhouse right in front of Germany's most important national monument – the Brandenburg Gate in Berlin. This toilet queue was part of "<u>The World's Longest Toilet Queue</u>", a worldwide initiative taking place in more than 70 countries to raise awareness for the 2.5 billion people who still lack access to sanitation organised by WASH United's partners EndWaterPoverty and WSSCC. The Berlin queue was led by Catarina de Albuquerque (United Nations Independent Expert on the Right to Water and Sanitation and WASH United ambassador) as well as UNSGAB Vice Chair Dr. Uschi Eid and Green Party leader Renate Künast.




Journal Sustainable Sanitation Practice on "Use of urine" – Apr. 2010



The third issue of the Sustainable Sanitation Practice (SSP) Journal with the title "Use of urine" is now available online (free of charge). It contains for example research findings for urine use in agriculture and gardening in Burkina Faso, Niger, Ethiopia and USA. #### UN-Water, Worldwide GLAAS report now available – Apr. 2010



The Global Annual Assessment of Sanitation and Drinking-Water (GLAAS) is a UN-Water initiative implemented by the World Health Organization (WHO). The objective of UN-Water GLAAS is to provide policy makers at all levels with a reliable, easily accessible, comprehensive and global analysis of the evidence to make informed decisions in sanitation and drinking-water. As one example: Improved access to sanitation and water produces economic benefits that range from US\$ 3 to US\$ 34 per US\$ 1 invested, increasing a country's gross domestic product

(GDP) by an estimated 2% to 7%.

### GLASS report 2010

WHO/UNICEF, worldwide Progress on sanitation and drinking water (JMP report update) – Mar. 2010



For the first time in this series of JMP reports, the word "sanitation" appears before "drinking water" in the title – does that signify something...?

The JMP report presents the current status and trends in 209 countries or territories towards reaching the drinking-water and sanitation MDG target, along with an assessment as to what these trends reveal. Unless huge efforts are



made, the proportion of people without access to basic sanitation will not be halved by 2015. Even if we meet the MDG target, there will still be

1.7 billion people without access to basic sanitation.

JMP report (Update in 2010)

BMBF (German Federal Ministry of Education and Research) Closing Nutrient Cycles in Decentralised Water Treatment Systems in the Mekong Delta (SANSED project) – Apr. 2009 SANSED, the Vietnamese-German joint research project studied the suitability of decentralised water treatment systems to recover nutrients and to produce safe fertilisers. Within the project, a variety of treatment systems for both - drinking and wastewater – were installed and operated at a university. Besides operation, the substrates of the wastewater treatment units were tested on their suitability as organic fertilisers, supplemented by socio-economical and hygienic studies.
