

Keep area around the toilet clean and wipe seat regularly

DO'S



Keep the toilet lid closed to reduce flies



Keep door closed



Wash hands with soap after using the toilet



Make sure vent is covered with mesh to keep out flies



Use toilet paper only



## DONT'S



Don't use any disinfectants, these kill good bacteria



Don't throw stones, old clothes, foodstuff etc. into the pit



Don't let the toilet overflow as this will be a health hazard




Don't allow water into the pit



# Pit Latrine emptying programme


This is a municipality programme to empty pit latrines in your area every five years. The programme represents the Municipality's commitment to a healthy community environment



## Who qualifies for emptying of a pit latrine?

Residents of eThekwini Municipality who have a formal pit latrine

Unlined or poorly constructed toilets will not be emptied



#### How will the contents be removed?



If the latrine has a concrete slab, this will be removed to allow for emptying



Teams will remove the contents for disposal

### On completion:



Cover slabs will be put back



Householder will sign off that the job is complete

**NB: NO TOILET REPAIRS WILL BE UNDERTAKEN** 

#### How can you assist?

Provide reasonable access to your pit latrine from the road How should you maintain your latrine?.

If the latrine fills up before the next emptying cycle (five years), you the homeowner, will be responsible for the emptying



Don't put solid waste into the latrine (e.g. plastic, stones, metal, etc.)



Don't put any wastewater (i.e. kitchen water, bath water) or allow stormwater to get into the pit. This can cause the sides of the pit to collapse and the pit will not be able to drain effectively



Any foreign objects or water will stop the waste from breaking down and cause it to fill up quickly.

Solid waste also causes smells. Solid waste makes it difficult to empty which increases the cost to the Municipality

DONT USE YOUR TOILET AS A RUBBISH BIN!
