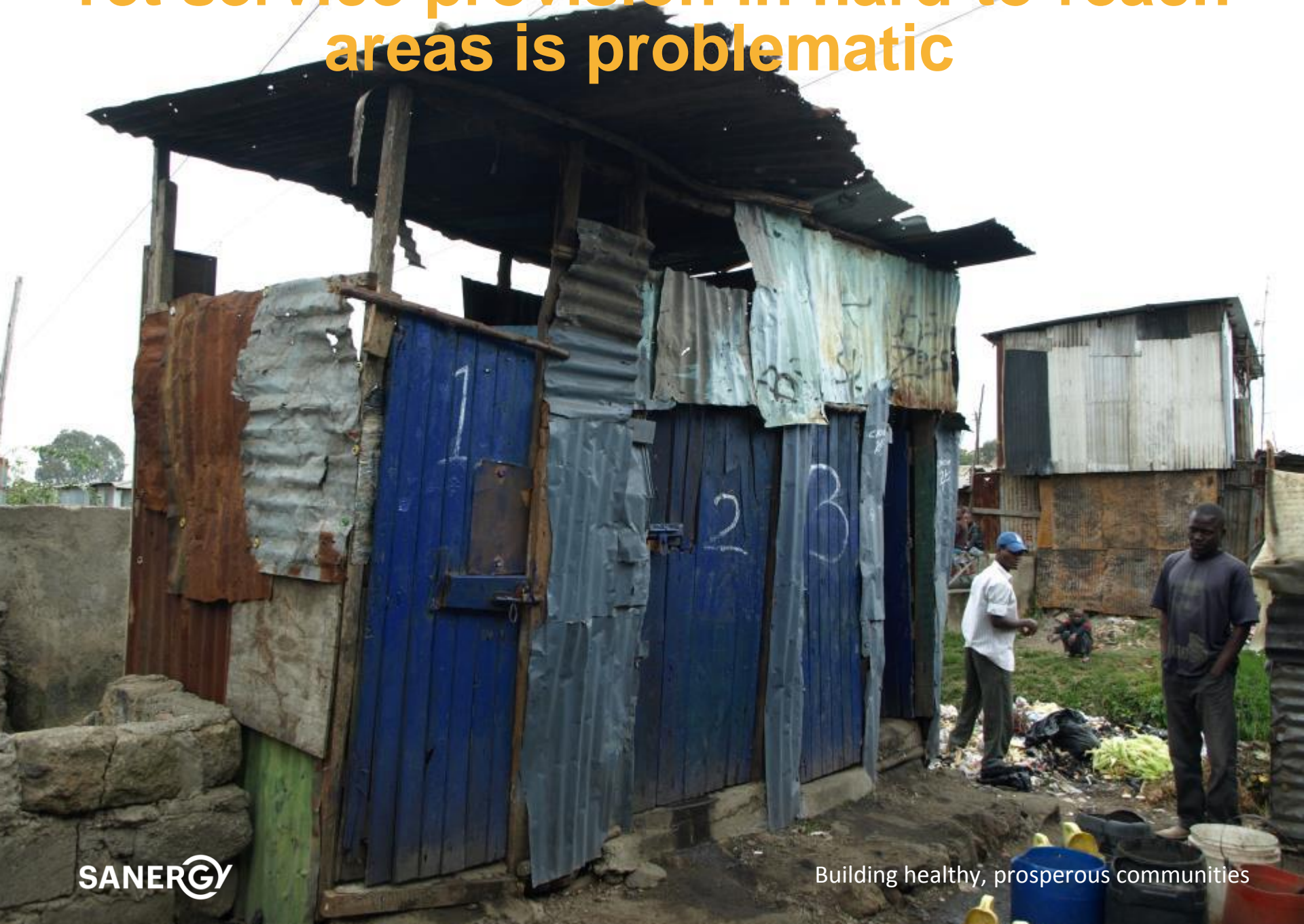

Yet service provision in hard-to-reach areas is problematic

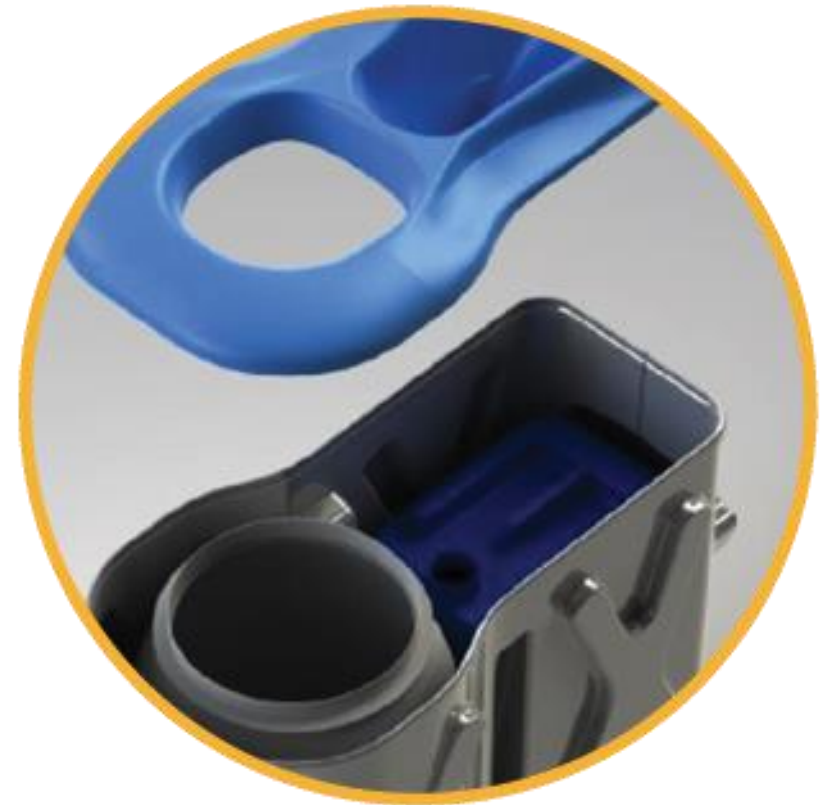


Clear policy for private solutions to public needs
