Inaugural Session

The one and a half day SANIVATION'2017 event which was organised on behalf of World Toilet Day started with an inaugural function by the hands of Honourable, Mayor Mrs. Mukta Tilak, Pune Municipal Corporation, Dr. Nitin Karmalkar, Vice Chancellor, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Mr. Yusuf Kabir, Program Specialist, UNICEF, Rtn. Abhay Gadgil, District Governor, RI 3131, Mr. Dayanand Panse, Director, Ecosan Services Foundation and many more eminent personalities who shared their views on the current sanitation conditions and how the challenges can be overcome.

Speaking at the inaugural function of SANIVATION'2017 Honourable Mayor Mukta Tilak said that India needs trained people to manage public toilets. She also informed that PMC plans to build 11 sewage treatment plants (STP) under the 1000 crore project to develop underground drainage system and STPs.

Every event has its own distinguished feature like publication of souvenir. Honourable Mayor Mrs. Mukta Tilak who inaugurated the event by releasing the souvenir of SANIVATION'2017, which comprised of different articles under sub-themes like "Need of Integrated Wastewater Management", "People's and NGO's role in Maintaining Public Sanitation Facilities", "Start-ups in Sanitation Sector" and different research papers.

SuSanA India Chapter Seminar: Towards ODF+ Urban Maharashtra Pune

18 November 2017, 2:30 PM to 5:30 PM

The Maharashtra State government has recently declared all cities to be open defecation-free. Under the Swachh Maharashtra Mission, started in 2015, the state had set out to achieve this by 2018, but has reached its goal earlier. As per the Government of India's norms, this means all households have toilets and nobody defecates in the open.

The Ecosan Services Foundation, the India Sanitation Coalition and the SuSanA India Chapter secretariat are organizing a seminar to analyse this achievement. It will explore ways to make urban Maharashtra ODF+ or better. This entails consolidating gains, safely and effectively collecting solid and liquid waste, faecal sludge management, and ensuring systems are in place and adequately resourced.

The seminar presented alternatives to the conventional approaches of pipes, pumps and plants for handling the rapidly-growing volumes of solid waste, sewage and faecal sludge that accompany urban growth and will discuss the needs for a holistic, city-wide planning approaches.

Urgent Run Event

For the past few years, in the lead-up to UN World Toilet Day, communities worldwide have come together for sanitation-themed Urgent Runs, with more than 63 events held in 42 countries. The Urgent Run formats vary and include fun runs, educational events, awareness walks, toilet cleaning programs, carnivals and even motorbike parades. The Global Urgent Run is a call for urgent action to end the sanitation crisis.

Our aim in organising Urgent Run was to create awareness amongst the masses to throw light on the shit that happens behind the close doors to bring people together, to raise awareness for the global sanitation challenge and engage people with sanitation issues in their local communities. The day started early morning 6.00 am with "URGENT RUN" – which was in support to the run organised worldwide. Nearly 450 participants joined the run with great energy and spirit.



The flag off of Urgent Run was done early morning 6:30 am from Vrindavan Lawns, Baner road which covered almost 7 km long track. Participants from the age group 5 years to the age group of 85 years old joined the urgent run. Participants enjoyed the event with great energy and spirit.

Various slogans and messages were displayed all over the run track to spread public awareness about sanitation. Some of them were like "Don't hush the FLUSH, TOILET talk need not make you blush", "Har mod pe ho commode toh Bharat ka na ho koi tod", "4.5 billion people – either have no toilets at home or one that doesn't safely manage excreta, etc."
