Objectives at launch

- Considering the recent increased political and civil efforts to accelerate sanitation provision in India, the SuSanA India Chapter was launched in June 2016. Its objectives were
- SuSanA knowledge products, community and learning services improve their efficiency and have a larger impact in India by adapting to local needs
- SuSanA members and partner organisations in the region exchange practical knowledge from their field experiences and SuSanA's global network, network and cooperate within India
- SuSanA members and partner organisations increase impact and efficiency of their work in the region by combining their resources and avoiding duplication of efforts while using SuSanA as a sounding board and its global reach for dissemination.

Key activities

- ▶ Build the local membership; now at 2,500 from 1,700 at launch. These comprise practitioners, government, companies, academics and NGO staff. These were provided with help on how to use the forum.
- Core activities:
 - ► Thematic discussions on sanitation-related issues
 - Other sections of the India Chapter site were populated with several proven SuSanA tools such as the SuSanA library, the Discussion Forum, Thematic Discussion Series, publications and working group factsheets
 - Face -to-face meetings
