CONTEXT

- > Schools are potential nodes for disease transmission and unsafe schools pose health and development hazards.
- Recent studies show strong evidence that lack of proper water and sanitation facilities leads to malnutrition, resulting in stunted growth in children
- > In the absence of menstrual management, adolescent girls prefer to skip school leading to absenteeism.
- > Schools should ensure basic amenities and facilities to ensure safety
- According to Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act 2009 GoI implemented schemes such as Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), Mid -day Day Meal Scheme (MDM) and Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV) have helped the country steadily progress towards the goal of universal elementary education.

IMPORTANCE OF WATER SANITATION AND HYGEINE (WASH) IN SCHOOLS

Every school in the country is expected to have these essential elements

- > Sanitation
- > Daily hand wash with soap before meal
- Drinking water
- Operation & Maintenance
- > Behavior change communication
- Capacity building

SWACHH BHARAT SWACHH VIDYALAYA (SBSV)

- In this context, in 2014, MHRD launched 'Swachh Bharat Swachh Vidyalaya' (SBSV) initiative to ensure that all schools in India have access to separate functional toilets or boys and girls. The initiative also has its emphasis on promoting safe and appropriate hygiene practices in schools and behavior among children.
- SBSV is supported by legislation and is championed by the Honorable Prime Minister and supported by the Right to Education Act (2009)
- The national flagship programmes, Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) and the Nirmal Gram Puraskar also support this requirement.


OBJECTIVES

- Schools will make incremental improvements to achieve better standards.
- Incentivizing District Collectors will ensure positive action, greater responsibility and also secure a good enabling environment

- Functional HW facilities for use before school meals
- Safe disposal of solid and liquid waste
- Cleaning and Maintenance of school environment
- Hygiene education in schools
- Hygiene practices by students and cooks of MDM

The performance of the schools will be evaluated under the following categories

- o Water − 22 marks
- o Toilets − 28 marks
- Handwashing with Soap 20 marks
- Operations and Maintenance 15 marks
- Behavior Change and Capacity Building -15 marks


- > All Government schools in Rural and Urban areas

SCHOOL REGISTRATIONS

- All schools were invited to apply for the awards by 12th August 2016
- The registration of schools would be done with the U-DISE code of the school. Schhosl that did not have a UDISE-Code, had to download the Data Capture Format (DCF) and submit at Block / District / State level office to generate the U-DISE Code.
- First completed the Primary Information section in the prescribed format. Upon submission, a "Password" will be send to the mobile number registered.
- Schools login with the U-DISE code and Password to complete the rest of the six sections of the survey.




- Received overwhelming response from government schools all over India




















STATE WISE BREAKUP

- Lowest application has been received from Arunachal Pradesh (3 schools) and Jammu and Kashmir(6 schools).


TYPE OF SCHOOLS WHICH HAVE APPLIED FOR THE SELF-CERTIFICATION










