
## Why Reforms

#### **Pre-reform challenges:**

#### Flawed legal and institutional framework

- Over centralization of authority
- Conflicting institutional roles
- Abuse of power
- Lack of transparency and accountability
- Inadequate sector funding
- Poor infrastructure
- Limited water resources
- Poor service delivery
- Inadequate consumer orientation
- •Overall: Severe deficiencies in management of water supply and sanitation
- → needs of Kenyan population could not adequately be fulfilled


#### Institutional Set-up in the Reformed Water Sector



### **Implications of Reforms**

- Separation of policy, regulation, asset holding and service provision to improve ...
  - sector performance
  - transparency and governance
- Need to frame multiple new players in the subsector by a set of common rules, guidelines and regulations in order to achieve ...
  - common standards for the protection of consumer interests
  - efficient, affordable and sustainable services
- Commercialization:
  - need to balance social needs (human right to water and sanitation) and commercial needs (sustainability of services)
