Limited Sustainable Sanitation Capacity in the World!! Serious lack of capacity among professionals

- Poor level of understanding and interest among all water and sanitation professionals
- Few comprehensive university programs exist
- Governments, municipalities, stakeholders, NGOs, industry, all suffer from lack of capacity
- Taboos have prevented an open dialogue on sanitation
- Sanitation has yet to become a sustainability issue


The consultation ,education of ,and communication with end users and stakeholders within a participatory process is crucial for the sustainability




What is a knowledge node?

- An organisation or network of organizations that can take a leading role for capacity development for sustainable sanitation in a country or region.
- Identification of organizations is on-going
 - 1. Independent scoping study
 - 2. Validation of results from scoping study in workshop with stakeholders
 - 3. Call for proposal to host the node
 - 4. Evaluation of node hosting proposals
 - 5. Establishment of node
