SuSanA promotes knowledge exchange and learning










New SuSanA Sister Platform

SFD Promotion Initiative


- Current status: nearly 250 cities have an SFD

241 SFDs in 235 Cities Worldwide








What's new on the SuSanA SFD Portal?

SFD goes multilingual

- The SFD Manual was already available in French, Arabic,
 Spanish and Portugese
- The content of the website can now be translated in more than 100 languages
- The SFD matrix, SFD grafic generator and the SFD graphs are now available in Spanish, French, Arabic, Hindi and Bengali
- The SFD Lite report template are soon available in the same languages
- Next step: translate the training video and material
