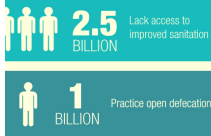


# WHAT'S A TOILET WORTH?

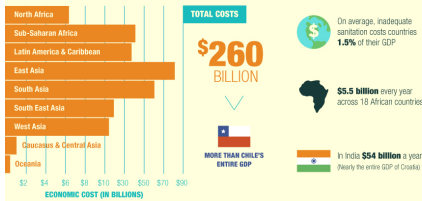


### % WITHOUT ACCESS TO IMPROVED SANITATION

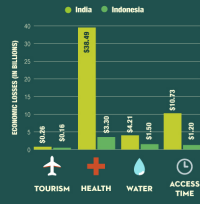

### THE GLOBAL COSTS OF INADEQUATE SANITATION



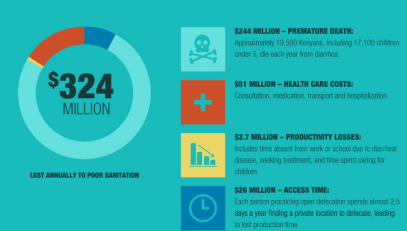
### BREAKDOWN OF IMPACTS OF INADEQUATE SANITATION: INDIA AND INDONESIA



### INDIRECT IMPACT OF DIARRHEAL DISEASE

- DIARRHEA**  
Due to poor water and sanitation, diarrhea causes 1.4 million preventable child deaths per year.
- STUNTING**  
India has some of the world's worst stunting as a result of more than half of its population not using any toilet or latrine.
- LOWER SCHOOL & WORK PRODUCTIVITY**  
Contaminating economic impacts of at least 3% of GDP.

### EXAMPLE: INDONESIA



- COMMITTING TO TARGETS**  
Implement policy and financial support to lead to increased spending on sanitation services, especially where countries are most off-track.
- SUSTAINABILITY**  
Ensure funds and mechanisms are in place for adequate operations and maintenance to sustain services.
- TARGETING POOREST**  
Provide additional support to increase access for the poorest to ensure socio-economic benefits are spread equitably among the population.
