Climate Change	 The water and sanitation sectors can contribute to climate mitigation and potentially mobilize climate financing Climate mitigation in the water and sanitation sector have far-reaching positive impacts in multiple sectors (Co-Benefits).
Digital approaches in sanitation	 Examples and opportunities: What are the digital approaches the table is aware of and what are possible opportunities for digital approaches to improve the sanitation chain? Skills: How do we ensure that sanitation service providers, governments and users (e.g. Households) have the skill set to operate/use digital system.
Gender - "Women's Sanitation Professional Network"	 What are the reasons for the growing demand for a women's network? How can we ascertain the involvement of women from the Global South in such a network? With the great challenge of SDG 6, we need more (female) professionals on all levels. How could a network contribute to overcome the current capacity gap?
Leave no one behind	 What are the policy, institutional, regulatory and related challenges of looking at inclusive sanitation in a county/district/province-wide way? What are the service delivery and technological challenges of planning for and delivering county/distrcict/province-wide inclusive way?
WASH in institutions	1. How can we use monitoring data to trigger action in WASH in Institutions?
Financing Sanitation - Subsidies	 Scarce public resources in the sector are overwhelmingly directed towards networked water supply services. How can sanitation specialists better influence policymakers to shift resources to on-site and/or sewered sanitation services to ensure SDG 6 is met. The bias against hardware subsidies for household infrastructure in urban and rural sanitation: How can policymakers move towards pursuing comprehensive context-specific cost-benefit analyses of all possible subsidy packages for sanitation (rural and urban) in a given locality, which may include hardware subsidies, sanitation marketing, FSM services, etc. and shift away from issuing blanket recommendations such as CLTS?
FSM in Cities	 What are the key elements driving colective action towards urban sanitation for all? What integrated approaches do exist to tackle the urban sanitation crisis?
