

Transport alternatives to Swedish History Museum, located at Narvavägen 13-17, 114 84 Stockholm:

- Travel from the **Central Railway Station** in Stockholm to **Karlaplan** by **public transport**. Its a 14 min. ride from the central station
- Exit the central station and start from >T-Centralen<. You can reach the meeting venue **Metro number 13 direction Ropsten T-bana**, every 5 min. Get off after 3 min at the second stop Karlaplan. Head west and cross the roundabout toward Karlaplan. Karlaplan turns slightly left and becomes Styrmansgatan. Turn left onto Storgatan, then turn left again, the Swedish History Museum will be on the left.
