In cooperation with innovative partners, the Exposure and Dialogue Programme (EDP) Association facilitates direct encounters between people living in poverty and decisionmakers from the fields of politics, public administration, business, science, the church and the civil society.

Such personal encounter with the poor is to facilitate a change of perspective which can motivate participants to work more strongly for selfhelp-oriented poverty reduction.

To make this happen, EDP is being organised as a platform of reflection and dialogue.




Aims and Objectives







Examples what participants learned



"Whenever I have to decide on a new project, I picture the faces of my host family and ask myself: What would be the impact of this project on a family comparable to the one I stayed with?" KfW Development Bank official


Follow up process

Follow up meeting:

- About 3-5 month after being back home (preferable with one representative of the partner organisation)
- Documentation of the results with the life stories and experience reports of the participants
- Analysis/ Publication



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Possible Participants

Possible Questions in the Dialogue



- What are the criteria of success of ecosan systems on the spot?
- How are users to be integrated into decisionmaking processes?
- Which socio-cultural conditions play a role for the implementation of sustainable sanitation systems?
- Which societal, political, and legal frameworks are necessary?
- Which are possible strategies to proliferate the use of reuse oriented sanitation systems?

Possible Contribution of the EDP



- Deepening knowledge on ecosan systems in practice
- Better Knowledge of the criteria for acceptance of the end user
- Tangible strategies for the proliferation of reuse oriented sanitation systems
- Key persons who are motivated to bring forward the necessary paradigm change
- Networking of national and international actors in the field of sustainable sanitation



Organisation and Logistics

Preliminary preparation itinerary

- Till spring 2008: Elaboration of concept and goals of the planned EDP
- Spring 2008: Presentation of methodology to the partner organisation (staff involved in the organisation and conducting the EDP (facilitator) and others interested); determination of criteria for selection of host families
- Summer:Training of facilitators, visiting selected host
families together with the partner organisation
- October 2008: Conducting EDP (17.-26. October 2008)
- After October 2008: Follow up with families and organisation.
