- elaboration of ToR for a study for financial and economic analysis of ecosan in sub-Saharan by WSP
- economics of sanitation initiative ongoing study in South East Asia by WSP
- preliminary literature on costs and economics of sanitaion review by gtz
- proposal of questionnaire on economic data within the SuSanA google earth based data bank for sanitation projects by gtz
